Management of risk allowance by the government for the human resource involved in the treatment of COVID-19

100% of starting salary:

Human Resource who are involved in the laboratory testing, collection of samples of isolated and infected patients, and directly involved in treatment.

75% of starting salary:

Human Resource who are indirectly involved in the treatment of the isolated and infected patients and providing imaging service.

50% of starting salary

Human Resource involved in the help desks established in Tribhuvan International Airport, India and China border, the packaging and transport of the samples, transport o the infected individuals, quarantine facilities, fever clinics, isolation wards, health emergency centers.

The medicines, health items and equipment provided by various organizations, authorities or individuals to the hospitals and other bodies specified by the Ministry of Health for the prevention, control and treatment of corona will be provided a discount on tariff until Jestha 14.



We have heard that streets are now overcrowded due to the indiscriminate distribution of e-passes by the administration.

The administration has taken new steps to tighten the distribution of e-pass to limit the movements. For instance, the District Administration office has decided to provide e-passes to only those who are attending the funeral of a family member. Some districts, however, have completely stopped e-pass analyzing the risk.

What is the latest update from abroad?

Saudi Arabia: The recent data that has come out highlights that there are 42 infected Nepalis in Saudi Arabia. Majority of the infected are in Jedda Qatar: Several companies in Qatar are making workers sign end of service letter by telling them it is gratuity. Similarly, many companies have also asked for forced resignation from the workers. The ones who are asked to force resignation are also staying in their own rooms as the flights to Nepal are canceled.

Malaysia: The Embassy of Nepal in Malaysia is collecting data of Nepalis there. The form can be found in the facebook page of the embassy which is www.facebook.com/nepalembassykl where you can fill in your details and about your current situation. This data is collected to prioritize support coming in from diplomatic institutions for rescue of Nepalis from abroad if such an environment gets created in the future.

Measures to be taken to reduce the risk of **COVID-19 and normalize public life:**

Prior Preparation: Points to review during lockdown

External Flights:

- Stop flight to the countries with existing cases. In case of urgency, take PCR test report into consideration.
- Put the returnees in guarantine, conduct tests as per the standard practice, and then send them home.



Internal Flights:

- Increase the scope and rate of tests until the cases persist. Take a test report under consideration for flights.
- Except for the critical patients, ask the individuals to bear the expenditure of the flight.
 - Conduct pre-health tests for pilot and co-pilot.

Towards road transport:

Until the infection persists,

- Allow one person to ride on a motorcycle and cycle and allow one person in the driving seat and one in the back seat for car, jeep, taxi and tempo.
- Leave the middle seat of the bus, minibus, van vacant and keep only one person in one row. Determine the passenger fee as the investment cost might increase.
- Keep them in guarantine after reaching the destination.
- Only the driver and co-driver should travel in the cargo vehicles.
- Make use of sanitizer, mask and gloves along with mandatory physical and social distance maitainenance during travel and shopping.

Towards the operation of agriculture, industry, development, construction and shop

- Make social distancing, self-guarantine and arrangement of personal health equipment mandatory.
- Increase the investment on health items, training of health professionals, lab, treatment and insurance.
- Ensure the PPE set in ambulance.
- Allocate the treatment places in government and private hospitals.
- Ensure the personal security materials, insurance and incentives for the security other mobilized personnels in the field.
- Focus on the cost-sharing of guarantine expenses.

• Search for potential infectants, collect information, and manage guarantine.

- Seal the areas alongside conducting tests and treatment, if required, show decent behavior towards • the patients.
- Relief: the concerned ward should fully or partially carry out the relief distribution in the allocated place and time, except for the case of people with disabilities.
- Ward should receive everyone's help and volunteers should be mobilized in coordination with ward.
- Spread awareness through online platforms as much as possible.
- Become suitable for conducting tests by increasing the centers, maintaining social distancing, using sanitizer, masks and gloves.
- Take strict measures to conduct emergency and follow-up treatment.
- Bring into practice cluster-based monitoring, resource management, coordination, information sharing, recording documents and reporting.

The total number of people in quarantine in the last week of April increased by four times. This number reflects the movement of people from one place to another and the need for staying in quarantine. Many people who are in quarantine now, need to stay there for a couple of weeks more, which means the confirmed cases of COVID-19 are likely to surge if there is community transmission in Nepal.
