By providing the public with facts, the CCC ensures a better understanding of needs regarding the coronavirus and debunks rumours before they can do more harm.

#### Some new rules and provisions regarding COVID-19

1. In case of those going abroad, the COVID-19 test will be conducted only by Nepal Government's Level "A" laboratory and biometric or other similar systems will be implemented to identify such individuals.





- 2. The individuals giving the samples for testing should mandatorily verify the identity cards issued by the Government of Nepal.
- 3. In case of all those who come to Nepal from abroad via land or air will be mandatorily kept in quarantine for 14 days and will be tested only if symptoms are seen during that period.





- 4. All the PCR testing laboratories for COVID-19 should store the samples confirmed negative during PCR testing for up to 1 month and for samples confirmed positive up to 3 months.
- 5. Until now only the positive or negative report of the COVID-19 test was being provided, but from now onwards, even if the inclusive report is received, it will also be considered as positive.



#### A temporary office to be established in Saudi Arabia to renew passports

For the workers living in Saudi Arabia with need to renew their passports, it has been said that an office will be set up in places far from Riyadh for convenience as the Nepal Embassy in Riyadh is far in terms of distance.

Cities where the temporary office will be set up and their date of operation

- 1. Dammam 4 December 2020, Friday
- 2. Jubel 11 December 2020, Friday

The information about the place and date for the set up of the temporary office will be announced later.


- Photographs, fingerprints, signatures, etc will be collected at these places
- Those who are yet to fill up the online form for passport renewal can fill up the online form at <a href="https://forms.gle/pryfMdChxs2QHCPi6">https://forms.gle/pryfMdChxs2QHCPi6</a> by themselves or with the help of their friends as soon as possible.
- The fees forpassport renewal is 200 riyals and for lost or damaged passports is 400 riyals. In case the passport has been lost, the person should be present with the police report, company letter, photocopy of the old passport and other documents.



"Many citizens have returned to our municipality from India and other nations. If we become able to utilize skilled manpower among those who have returned within the local level, we will be able to fulfill the needs of the municipality. Along with that we already have economical challenges. We are not in a situation where we can provide employment to a large number of returnee migrants and hold them here. But a total of 2 crores i.e., 1 crore from the central level and 1 crore from municipality have been allocated for goat

rearing as a business. The Prime Minister's and the Chief Minister's Employment program too prioritizes returnee migrant workers. However, the sad thing is that even in this situation, those who have returned from India still plead with us to create a favourable environment for working in India."

#### Deputy Chairperson, Lekbesi Municipality Surkhet

"Many youths who have returned from foreign employment because of COVID-19 have now embraced agriculture. They are providing evidence that one does not have to go abroad and can do many things through agriculture. Many youths who have returned from foreign employment come to us to seek suggestions regarding "What to do?", "How to do?", etc. We reply to them saying that the local level is suitable for agriculture and animal husbandry. We have differentiated different pocket areas in agriculture to work for those



who have returned from foreign countries. We work prioritizing youth who have returned from foreign countries and their family."




#### Sharmila Chhatkuli

"After I had fever, headache, throat and body pain I stayed in quarantine. When my condition did not improve, I was referred to Kathmandu. Bir Hospital doubted me of having COVID-19 and did not admit me in the hospital. Then I was admitted to the emergency ward of the Teaching Hospital. There was no I.C.U at the teaching hospital, so I went to Man Mohan Hospital. I returned to teaching again. After 1 day, the COVID-19 result came to be negative and I was discharged. After I had reached home, COVID-19 test report of my

father and my husband who had taken me to hospital was positive. My test report showed positive too. Now I am fine. But I feel very sad because any patients do not get quick treatment because of COVID-19 and the way COVID-19 patients are viewed differently. If this is the condition of a health worker, what will be the condition of the public?"



#### Ten Districts with Highest Deaths due to COVID-19 in Nepal

The above graph shows the districts with the highest number of deaths because of COVID-19 in Nepal. These districts combined contribute to 65 percent of total deaths in Nepal while the districts within Kathmandu valley (Kathmandu, Bhaktapur and Lalitpur) alone contribute to more than one-third of all deaths. Kathmandu valley and the districts in this ranking are relatively well-facilitated and yet, the spread of COVID-19 seems more severe and widespread in these districts with more number of deaths. What are the government's plans to control this scenario?
