

Nepal Coronavirus CivActs Campaign





Population to be vaccinated in the first phase **4 lakh 30 thousand**




Time period to complete the first phase of vaccination **10 days**

Rumors & Facts



There is news suggesting that people who have received COVID-19 vaccination in Nepal are falling ill, won't it make a huge impact later?

Some people have shown normal side effects after being vaccinated against COVID-19. For instance, general effects such as pain and general swelling at the part where one was injected, headache, laziness, body ache, joint pain, lowering of body temperature, normal fever and nausea have been reported. So far, no serious side effects have been reported in the vaccinated people. A team of doctors and health workers have been prepared to mobilize for the management of any impact.

It is heard that the government has abolished many health institutions that provide medical care to workers going for foreign employment.

The health institution that conducts the health check-up of the workers going for foreign employment should be renewed within the end of Poush of each fiscal year. The approval of 10 health institutions that haven't renewed has been terminated. From now on, such health institutions are disgualified from conducting health check-up of the people going for foreign employment. 

New rules regarding the use of airports in the Gulf countries

Kuwait

From 1 June, Kuwait International Airport will charge 3 Dinar for departure passengers and 2 Dinar for passengers arriving in Kuwait. The information was mentioned in the press release issued by Minister of State for Housing Affairs and Minister of State for Service Affairs, Abdullah Marafi.

Saudi Arabia

From now on, 3 Riyals should be paid for using the services available at Dammam Airport.

UAE

- According to Emirates Airlines, passengers coming to Dubai from now on should bring a 72-hour PCR negative report. Earlier, a PCR negative report of upto 96 hours was required.
- Every person going to Abu Dhabi from other emirates should show PCR negative reports in their AI-Hosn Mobile Application. Even though it was mandatory to keep AI-Hosn Mobile app from earlier, now the app has become even more important after this rule.


Oman



Youths compelled to go abroad as government fails to provide the promised grant for agribusiness



Baliraj Pandey, 30 of Birendranagar Municipality, Ward no. 7 is a young farmer. Baliraj, who is very interested in business, is facing a tough time due to lack of investment. He started vegetable farming by renting 24 katthas of land three years ago after Karnali Province Government announced a grant. However, he, who started a vegetable business on loan, anticipating the subsidy, didn't get the grant.

As he didn't receive the grant, on one hand, he was forced to pay the interest of the loan and on the other hand, he faced difficulties to invest in seeds, fertilizers, pesticides and other necessities of the vegetable farm. Although he wanted to do business inside the country, he was left with no choice but to go abroad as he didn't receive any grant. He couldn't live here even for 7 months when he returned to Nepal during the lockdown. Although he wants to do business and live with his family, he is forced to work abroad to pay off the debts from home and business, earn extra to sustain his family and take forward his business.

He says, "It seems the province government doesn't

recognize the real farmers. The grants are distributed in terms of commission and power. Who would recognize someone like us? I wanted to start an agribusiness in the village. But the investment didn't materialize. I have come abroad with a conviction that I will start business with my own earnings." The Aarushi Agricultural Firm, named after his wife, Savitra Adhikari, is currently run by his wife, Savitra and father, Krishna Prasad Pandey.

The farm, which started three years ago with Cauliflower, now produces all kinds of vegetables including potatoes, bitter gourd, cucumber, beans and tomato. The farm, which was started with a loan of NRs. 1 lakh at 3 percent interest, has so far spent NRs. 6 lakhs.

Baliraj's father Krishna Prasad says, "The grants allocated by the government for farmers are distributed on the basis of connection. Those who continuously work do not get grants. The fake farmers who register their farms only for the grant and keep visiting the Ministry take benefit of the situation. Otherwise, my son wouldn't be compelled to go abroad after seeing no hope of the grant." He himself is a retired agricultural technician of the Regional Directorate of Agriculture. Last year, when the province government promised to provide a grant of NRs. 1 lakh 30 thousand, he brought plastic tunnels and other agricultural implements with his own interest, but didn't receive the final payment.

The chemical-free vegetables being exported from India to the province is limited in the declaration. Organic items produced here aren't valued. The province government also hasn't shown interest in it. Similar to Baliraj's family, thousands of farmers in Karnali are in trouble who started their business on loan after failing to garner investment. It is important for the concerned bodies to pay attention to this.







Anil Sen Thakuri

Health Inspector, Kohalpur Municipality, Banke

"We took Covid as our duty rather than a challenge and succeeded in defeating it. At present, all the health workers of Kohalpur Municipality have received vaccine against covid. People are also now more aware of covid. We are conducting free check-ups for people showing covid symptoms. As the effect of covid has gradually decreased, our workload has decreased as well. Even though the impact of the covid has

declined, we are still doing our part."

Deepak Sharma

Lab Assistant, Kohalpur Municipality, Banke

"I have been working in the frontline from the very beginning of the covid, in Banke. At the early stage, management of the covid was very difficult. I and one of my colleagues jointly collected 28,000 swabs. As my family members were scared by this, I convinced them saying as a health worker if we get scared and do not do our work then, no one else will look after other people. I stayed out of home for 7 months. Looking back at those times, I feel that I have done a wonderful job and I am very happy about that. "





Santosh Budha Kshetri

Medical Officer, COVID Temporary Hospital, Kohalpur, Banke

"We had worked at the times of limited manpower and resources. We did double shifts as well. At the early phase of covid, there was scarcity of PPE and mask. We have worked for 2/3 days using the same mask. Saving people from covid was our concerning priority more than the fear of the family members. However, when the community misbehaved with us

stating that corona was transmitted from health workers, that hurted us. It was especially difficult for the health workers living in rented houses. Despite many problems and challenges, we did not give up. As a result, of which the situation is now somewhat normal."
